#### Welcome to PETRA!



We are looking forward to a Christ-centered adventure with your children this year!

This year we will be studying the time period from 700BC - 700AD with a focus on the Roman Empire, Asia, and the Americas.

Our wonderful team of teachers will be covering the topics of religion from a Christian and early church perspective, history/art/culture, architecture/math, and science. Each week students will participate in PE and have a time of Bible application, discussion and public speaking practice within their classroom.

While PETRA offers classes for children in 1<sup>st</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> grades, Valley Church also provides programs in Thursday School, for children ages 3 months through 5 years old (Kindergarten) as of 9/1/18. These classes are similar to Sunday school and include Bible stories, memorizing Scripture and participating in lots of hands-on activities. While there is no fee for these classes, parents are required to volunteer in the classroom several times each year. For more information, please contact Lisa Chen.

#### **Our Mission**

To enable homeschooling moms to attend the Women's Bible Study by providing their children with a Christ-centered academic program focusing on World History from a Biblical perspective. We strive to provide a creative learning environment using group projects, public speaking, physical education and many other unique learning opportunities throughout the year.

Meanwhile, homeschooling mothers receive solid Bible teaching and are able to enjoy lively and challenging discussions with women of all ages.

This years Bible Study will be focused on the book of John, "Who do YOU say that I am?"

## **Our Background**

PETRA started in the 1980's by two homeschooling moms who wanted to attend the Thursday morning Women's Bible Study.

Over the years, PETRA has grown dramatically. Today we offer 1<sup>st</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> grade classes.

#### **Your Commitment**



Mothers are asked to commit to faithful Bible Study attendance or full time Thursday morning ministry. Mothers must be onsite during PETRA; this is not a drop-off program. As a courtesy, please inform us immediately if you become

unable to attend regularly.

As a co-op, parents are required to help in the classrooms a few times a year, and also during some of the Spring extended days.

## **On-Campus Policy**

The parent of a PETRA student in grades 1 through 9 brings her own children to class and remains on campus throughout the entire morning. An exception to this policy may be made in a few and limited circumstances such as maternity leave or chronic illness. A written request for an exception should be made to the PETRA Administrator and the Children's Director. This written request should include the name and contact information of an adult who will remain on campus and assume responsibility for the child. The proxy parent will carry with her a letter from the parent giving her permission to authorize any necessary medical care in the event of an emergency.


## Registration

#### **Fees**

## **Dropping Off Your Children**

You are encouraged to drop off your child(ren) at 9:00 for a transition time: a read aloud book from the time period being studied or other activity. Please do not leave your children until the teacher is present.

If you have children in Thursday school (nursery-kindergarten), please drop off your child(ren) in the PETRA classes before dropping off your child(ren) in the Thursday School classes.

The class lesson and Women's Bible Study begin promptly at 9:15 am.

## **Picking Up Your Children**

Please also pick up your Thursday school child(ren) before picking up your PETRA child(ren). Please be prompt in picking up your child(ren).

PETRA children in the 1<sup>st</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> grade class are to be picked up by their parent at the door of the activity center. PETRA students in the other classes (4<sup>th</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade and 6<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> grade) will be released from class and are to report directly to their parent. After class, all students are to be under the direct and active supervision of their parent.

PETRA/Thursday School families are reminded that other business is being conducted on campus, and are requested to leave the Valley Church campus within one hour after the classes end.

## **Wellness Policy**

PETRA strives to maintain healthy classrooms at all times. For the protection of all families, parents are requested not to bring a child who is ill.

## **Physical Education**



Physical Education is part of our school day.

Please remember to send your students in appropriate clothing, athletic shoes, and a water bottle.

As parents we believe God has a purpose for each of our children's lives. In PE we will be learning how to be good stewards of our bodies in order to fulfill that purpose. Through games, agility work, sport skill drills, stretching, and discussions on fuel intake we will address how to view what we do with our bodies and how we care of it as worship to the Creator.

We would love to avoid common pitfalls. If you know your child(ren) have concerns or fears please share those. Also remember to alert the PE teachers of any known conditions that they need to be aware of.

We expect each student to participate in the PE activities unless the lead teacher receives a note from the parent.

#### **Oral Presentations**

We encourage all students to do oral presentations (please see the Class Syllabus and Presentation Schedule). Please, no pets. We ask that at least three presentations be on a topic relevant to the time period being studied. Also, students in the older classes may be asked to prepare and present their testimony at one of the assigned times.

Oral Presentations will not receive a letter grade but will be assessed with a given rubric; we will provide comments/suggestions for improvement.

Due to room changes, 6th-9th grade students need to drop off their presentation materials in Room 3280 or with their teacher before the start of class.

#### Homework

Students will also be asked to memorize lines for the Drama production at the end of the year. The older the student, the more lines there will be. Students may also be asked to assist with stage props.

## Student Behavior & Supervision

Students are to behave respectfully toward their teachers, classmates, and also toward the Valley Church staff. Please make sure your children know to walk quietly in and around the buildings and to respect the planted areas around the grass.

While it is tempting, please instruct your children not to "raid the kitchen" during or after PETRA – especially on potluck days.

A PETRA parent is to be actively and directly supervising her own children while on campus before and after class time. After class, all children are welcome to play in the main grass quad, on the large playground, or quietly in the Campus Center. Children are expected to give careful and respectful consideration to all persons and facilities. The Activities Center and the kitchen are not open to children outside the usual PETRA class time hours. All other areas of the campus are closed to students.

A no-weapons policy will be strictly enforced. No child is to possess a weapon of any kind, including pocket knives, while on campus.

**No Wheels or Electronic Devices:** For safety reasons, we ask that you please leave all wheeled toys (scooters, skateboards, wave boards, etc.) at home.

Students may not have cell phones, electronic games, or devices with ear buds during class time. Toys or games of any kind are not allowed during PETRA unless used for a presentation.

## **Discipline Policy**

In the event a student has difficulty behaving in class, the teacher will take appropriate actions e.g. redirection and separation for a time to regroup, and notify the student's parents and the PETRA Director. If the behavior continues, the teacher will have a meeting with the mother. If behavior continues the student, mother, and teacher will meet with the PETRA Director. The student may be asked to stay home a week of PETRA. In the event the behavior continues, it will need to be discussed whether-PETRA is the right place for the student.

#### **Dress Code**

As a courtesy to others, we ask that all students dress modestly. Please be sure children wear comfortable clothing following these guidelines: undergarments (including sports bras and boxers) must not be visible. Please no tank tops or shirts with shoulder straps less than 3 inches wide. No low-cut shirts or bare midriffs. Shorts should be below fingertips in length (below mid-thigh).

## Progress Reports (1st – 9th Grade)

Students' progress will be evaluated once each year. The progress reports will be issued after the Closing Program in May. If your PSP requires a special form or has a different due date, please let us know.

## **Parent Participation**

Petra depends on parent participation. Parents need to provide snacks for their own children during class time (please, no nuts). In addition, you will be asked to help with some of the following:

**Closing Program Snacks:** Bring cookies/snacks for Closing Program.

**Classroom Helper:** Class assistant to help with classroom duties and activities during bible application and presentation time for all three classes.

**Cooking Day Helper:** Guide a group of students in preparing one or two recipes on Cooking Day, or prepare/supervise a craft or other activity while children are not cooking

**Cultural Fair / Craft Helpers:** Prepare a planned craft / snack/ activity. Supervise and encourage students as they participate in Cultural Fair or craft. Assist as needed with direction from the teachers.

**Staff children's Supervisor:** Monthly (after PETRA) – provide supervision to PETRA staff children while teachers are in the staff meeting.
