

Making the Most of Wednesday, September 30

"For this is the **love of God**, that we keep his commandments. And his **commandments are not burdensome**." -1 Jn 5:3

BETWEEN 6:00—9:00 AM: GOD'S GRACE TOWARD HUMAN LIFE, IN THE LAW

When last did you read through the pages of Exodus or Leviticus? Or are they still rather crisply stuck together? Have you ever reached the end of those stories & laws from Sinai and thought, *What incredible grace! O how our God loves and protects us!* Such a response might raise an eyebrow or two from those sitting next to you. Yet consider how good God's commands are for us, how his love for us spills over in them, how natural it is for a Godly person to think often about them (see Psalm 1), and how they ultimately point us to Christ. Summed up in the 10 Commandments, or even more basically in our love for God and for one another, God's Law reflects his desire for us to approach him correctly in our worship, and to care for one another as God cares for us—whether free or slaves, from different religious and ethnic backgrounds, seeking to make things right where wrong is done, that both locals and foreigners would be drawn to worship the only true & living God. Consider, for instance, how God's Law not only demands honor for elders and obedience to parents, but also justice for each person's life even before that child is born:

"When men strive together and hit a pregnant woman, so that her children come out, but there is no harm, the one who hit her shall surely be fined, as the woman's husband shall impose on him, and he shall pay as the judges determine. But if there is harm, then you shall pay life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, burn for burn, wound for wound, stripe for stripe." (**Exo 21:22-25**)



What other passages from the Law can you think of that reflect the intrinsic value of human life? the sacredness of the gender God gives us? the beauty of his intention for marriage? the importance of family? the command to come alongside and serve those who are hurting—even our enemies? O what incredible riches are to be found of God's unchanging character in his Law, and what wonderful examples of how messy people can walk in a way that pursues him with all their hearts! (**see Deut 6:5**, **Lev 19:18**) If you've never made it through those first 5 books of the Bible, today is a great day to start! Pray that God would show you a more faithful understanding of his unchanging character as you spend time in his illuminating Law.

BETWEEN 9:00 AM-12:00 PM: GOD'S PLAN FOR HUMANITY, IN CREATION

But why would God have given these laws? And what is the Law based on? God gave us his holy Law because we had strayed from his design for us in Creation. So we needed to see the reality both of our sin and of the only one who can restore our sin-diseased relationship with God & others. Hence God's Law is based on the same heart of Christ's that overflowed into Creation from the beginning, and that longs for us to reflect his glory and beauty well. That is why on so many occasions, when Jesus was asked about how we should live, he answered not simply by turning to the Law, but to his design for humanity from Creation (which was the basis for the Law).

Think for instance back to a Sabbath day that Matthew writes about, when the Pharisees try to trap Jesus for working on the Sabbath, *"Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"* they ask him. And how does he respond? He goes back to Creation, to compare the supreme value of human life above everything else in creation, and *therefore* the <u>lawfulness</u> of doing good to others on the Sabbath. (**Matt 12:9-14**) Or what about when Jesus is asked about divorce? Where does he turn? Not to the prophets, who upheld the Law before God's people. Not even Malachi, who addressed this issue specifically. Rather he turns again to Creation, to his good design for marriage from the beginning, and *therefore* the <u>lawlessness</u> of pursuing anything contrary. (**Matt 19:3-11**)

So when you are faced with questions (whether from others or from yourself) about how we should think and live, consider Christ; consider his example in answering such questions; and his own plan for humanity from Creation. The first 11 chapters of the Bible lay the foundation for every aspect of life and redemption. As we recognize how substantial his glory is that he imprinted onto mankind (who was made in God's own image, to reflect his beauty), we will gain a truer understanding of how fitting it is to stand up for the life of each person around us, **from womb to tomb**. Pray that God would open your eyes to see his plan for humanity as you carefully read about and reflect on the first several pages of the Bible.

BETWEEN 12:00—3:00 PM: GOD'S LOVE FOR LIFE, IN THE DEATH & LIFE OF CHRIST

As refreshing as the Law is, and as solid a basis it has in God's love for his good Creative order, it has never been able to restore a person's heart from its allegiance to sin. It only shows where we are lacking. But it did lay out a way that man was able to enter God's dreadful presence again—how God could come among his people, and his people not die under his good and holy justice. And it all points forward—or as it's been said otherwise, every story whispers the name of Jesus.

Jesus left his Father's side and came as a baby within his mother's womb. He was born like you and me into this broken world and knew every manner of grief. He experienced sin's effect on Creation and on the people around him, and was tempted to swear his own allegiance to sin. But he remained completely pure and became the only Lamb that there had ever been who would be able to remove our sin from us forever! It was for this very reason, he died for us who hated him; he loved us who killed him—so that we could look on God and not die. Just as God had said long ago through one of his prophets, *"Can a woman forget her nursing child, that she should have no compassion on the son of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you."* (Isa 49:15)

Dearly beloved in Christ, our Savior knows your sin. But **there is more mercy in him than there is sin in you.** Come to him for help & healing. Thank him. Worship him. He is good! Pray that he will grow your love for what is good, for what he loves; & grow your hatred for sin, for what he hates; so that we can lead others from sin to Christ.

BETWEEN 5:00—9:00 PM: GOD'S APPEAL TO US, IN WISDOM

In the last of the Proverbs, we find this exhortation, "Open your mouth for the speechless, in the cause of all who are appointed to destruction." (**Prov 31:8**) And that's exactly where we find ourselves now—amidst destruction of the speechless. Across our nation, we have greatly cheapened the glorious image he has placed on each person, and continue to put an end to millions of children's lives who are inside (and even outside) the womb. And this is not something seen only outside the church. In fact 65% of people who choose to get an abortion are from Christian and Catholic backgrounds! How can this be? Have we presented Christ to one another as he reveals himself in his Bible? Are we calling men to sexual purity and holding one another accountable before God, encouraging each another in the savors of our Savior? Are we looking for ways we can serve women around us who are in crises, & share one another's burdens? May we at Valley Church strive to think of the life he has given us, in the same way he thinks of us, **for our lives are not our own**. Pray that God would put such a deepened burden on our hearts to know him more, so that God's Word would be clearly and faithfully opened from our pulpits, and that we would run from sin that still lives in us toward God's warm embrace, as we seek to serve and encourage those around us.

Those who have been reading through today's prayer guide have had an opportunity to consider a Biblical framework for God's estimation of human life—it's set above everything else in all Creation, it is protected within his Law, and it is redeemed by God in Christ. You may also have noticed the thread running throughout it focusing on the life of those who are not yet born. During our time together, you'll get to hear some stories of how God has been working in various people's lives on the sidewalks of San Jose to protect some of these children, & to bring healing over stains of past sin.
