Questions for groups, families and individuals

1. Review the chart on the front called *Tortured and Triumphant Love: How Yahweh Came, Left, Returned and Transformed his People.* Review each "chapter" and get a sense of God's longsuffering and centuries-long love that ultimately triumph over our rejection. What does this history teach you about the character of God?

2. By talking in "bridegroom" terms to John's disciples, what is Jesus communicating to these people who knew the ancient prophecies and promises? Why so indirect?

3. It's easy for believers to fall into "TPE," that is, traditional, predictable, expected forms of worship, discipleship and evangelism. But new forms of devotion to and extension of the good news are necessary in every generation. Disciples must be "DIV," that is, diverse, inventive and venturous in their methods. How do you respond?
