## **BUILDING BRIDGES**

Grab your hard hat because there's vision construction at Valley Church. It's called "Building Bridges Inside and Out." Pastor Kurt shared it with us on Sunday, April 7. Here's what it's all about:

- Our groups SHOWING God's love
- Our church KNOWING how God is working

Here's some extra information:

**Bullet #1**: We believe that active membership in a DISCIPLE Group or ministry team is an indispensable spiritual habit. We can't "abound" in love and care for each other's "needs" (Phil. 1:9; 4:16) if we're not journeying with others in smaller bands, learning Scripture, praying and having fun. So we'll keep trying to involve people in groups.

**Bullet #2**: We believe that when groups reach out together, ministry is more enjoyable and effective. Jesus' disciples were a team that proclaimed the Kingdom and ministered to lost people together. Paul also loved to work with partners (Phil 4:3). We want to capture Paul's "we'll do it together" method. So we'll encourage our groups to participate together in one of the following five highlighted Showing projects:

- 1. Alpha/Reasonable Faith
- 2. Tennis and Sports Ministry
- 3. ISF (including welcome dinners, weekly meetings and friendship partners)
- 4. Children's Ministry outreach events (STEM Fair, Angel Breakfast, Bunny Breakfast, VBS and Camps)
- 5. MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers)

Of course, no group will be forced to serve in one of the five highlighted Showing projects. Groups will be free to express God's love to outsiders as the Spirit leads them.

**Bullet #3**: We believe that praise stories glorify God and encourage believers to be bold (Phil. 1:12–14). So we want to have more live testimonies, videos and pictures for the "praise of God" (Phil. 1:11). We'll do this through worship services and two church-wide Celebration Lunches. Every Wednesday morning, Sparrows flutter to the Student Center to participate in Bible stories and verses, music, movement and art. Each activity is designed with a sensory-rich approach to appeal to all kinds of learners. Sparrows also looks for opportunities to serve other ministries. In 2018, they baked treats for Operation Christmas Child (OCC) volunteers, Zimbabwe team members and Women's Bible Study attendees. Sparrows also unloaded shoe boxes for OCC and counted bottles and cans for the service project at Vacation Bible School (VBS). Our Sparrows ministry started with 2 families and has since grown to 6! The families have become a close-knit community, providing support for one another. We give God the glory for starting this much needed ministry at Valley, and we look expectantly to see how God will guide the expansion of this ministry in the future. # TENNIS MINISTRY TESTIMONY

Valley Church runs a Tennis Clinic as an outreach ministry to the community. Here is a testimony from one of the Tennis Clinic's coaches:

From a young age, I was taught that God was not real. The tennis ministry was the first step in a long process of God waging war against my pride and breaking down the barriers and walls to finally being reconciled to Him. My heart was too hardened against the message of Jesus at first, but the tennis camp was a crucial part of that process.

I had taken the job at Valley Church at the referral of a friend. I did not expect a gospel sharing at the end of each day's sharing session, but I stayed each time because I at least wanted to respect my employers and what they were trying to do with these kids. To be honest, I sat in the back with mostly a judgmental attitude towards the different messages that were presented, thinking that I was above what was being taught. I specifically remember the presentation of the grape juice and the pig feces as a representation of sin and thinking how ridiculous that was... and yet clearly, it stuck with me. When I tell people about the corrupting effects of sin, that's still the first illustration that comes to mind — it's been almost 7 years since then! It feels like just yesterday that I was in that room listening to that message. And that was the first time that I had heard the full gospel, a message that I now live for.

This clinic was also some of the first interactions that I had with Christians that were bold about their faith. Thomas was especially surprising for me. Here was a guy who loved Jesus seriously and yet was a vibrant personality, filled with life. This was also the beginning of something: the body of Christ becoming less foreign and more attractive.

It was through that tennis camp that Edward Tung, another one of the coaches at the clinic, connected me to his son, who happened to be doing ministry at the UC Berkeley campus, and the person who ended up leading me to Christ two years later. God knew exactly what I needed, the people that I needed to meet, the experiences that I needed, and He perfectly orchestrated that so I could be adopted as His Son. If He saved me, He can save others, too!
