BEST BEACH DAY EVER - VBS 2019 SUMMARY

Imagine your best beach day ever. Turquoise seas. Warm sand. Happy children. That's what it looked and sounded like around Valley Church the week of July 15 to 19. The sights and sounds of 338 children and 180 volunteers, from teenagers to golden agers, filled our campus for SonSurf Beach Bash Vacation Bible School. Now the waters have calmed and the air is still, but those who look closely will see God's footprints in the sand, and those who listen carefully will hear God's voice in the wind. SonSurf Beach Bash was more than fun and games and cookies by the dozen. It was a place for boys and girls to meet up with Jesus. For some it was a first encounter; for others it was a closer encounter. A total of 81 children visited our Gospel Station to make a commitment to follow Jesus. These spiritual encounters will continue to ripple through the lives of all who participated in SonSurf Beach Bash.

Those ripples will soon reach across the ocean to the country of Armenia. Child Evangelism Fellowship has purchased some land there and plans to build a Bible camp where Armenian children can learn the good news about Jesus. The camp has not been built yet, so the boys and girls at VBS brought in money to help buy materials and supplies for the camp. Altogether we collected a total of \$4,545. Armenia used to be ruled by a government that didn't believe in God, and boys and girls were sent to camp to be taught there was no God. Now boys and girls in Armenia will get to attend camp and learn about the living God who loves them and wants to have a personal relationship with them.

At SonSurf Beach Bash, we were not building sandcastles to be easily washed away. We were building disciples who will love and follow Jesus all their lives. Please praise God for the great work He began at our SonSurf Beach Bash VBS, and please accept the thanks of the VBS team for your prayers and support.
